

The pathway is the home to many exciting running and biking events. It links to many things mentioned in this guide. **The Old Idaho Penitentiary** and **Railroad Depot** offer a glimpse into Boise’s history along with a variety of museums. There are also an abundance of wildlife areas including **The Boise Zoo** and bird sanctuary.

Another great advantage is the **Bogus Basin** ski resort. You can be in downtown Boise and in less than half an hour you can be on the lift skiing down the slopes of Bogus Basin.

Boise has so much to offer, but don’t let that stop you from driving an hour or two to **McCall** or **Sun Valley** to stay in a cabin and enjoy the outdoors. ## Northend

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
# LIVING IN EAGLE

# LIVING IN KUNA

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





## **Boise River Green Belt Walk/Run/Ride**

29 Miles of tree-lined pathways, perfect for bikers, runners, skaters, bladders, and walkers. The greenbelt takes you through the heart of the city, along the **Boise State University Campus**, through multiple parks, multiple golf courses, the **MK nature center**, and much more.

## **Table Rock Hike**

Situated on the East side of the city, in the **Boise foothills**, it is marked by a 60-foot illuminated cross that can be seen across the valley. This 3.7-mile round-trip hike is a must-do; the sandstone plateau towers over the city and gives you one of the best views in all of Idaho. Located just minutes from downtown, the main trail starts right next to the **Historic Old Idaho Penitentiary**.

## **Boise River Float**

Floating the boise river is one the city's signature summer experiences- an easy relaxing adventure that feels like a mini-vacation right in the heart of town. The float starts at **Barber Park**, where you can rent rafts, tubes, or inflatable kayaks, and ends 6 miles downstream at **Ann Morrison Park**. It's a family friendly float that takes about 2-3 hours.

## **Bogus Basin Ski Resort**

Bogus Basin is Boise's backyard playground- a four-season mountain resort just 16 miles from downtown offering everything from snowboarding in the winter to world-class mountain biking in the summer. In the colder months, Bogus transforms into a snowy wonderland with 2,600 acres of terrain, night skiing, snowboarding and tubing. There are runs for all levels of experience. When the snow melts, the mountain switches gears and becomes one of Idaho's top mountain biking destinations. Riders get access to dozens of miles of trails from smooth cross-country loops to fast downhill lines, and you can even take the chairlift for lift-served riding.

## **Lucky Peak State Park**

Boise's go-to spot for sun, water, and laid-back lake vibes. Just a quick 15 minutes from downtown. It's made up of three main areas: **Sandy Point**, the big grassy beach where families swim and relax. **Discovery Park**, perfect for picnics and wading in the river. **Sping Shores Marina**, where you can rent boats, jet skis, paddleboards, and spend the day exploring miles of open water.

## **Natural Hot Springs Adventures**

With 340 natural hot springs in the state, Idaho has the most natural hot springs in the PNW. Some of the closest to town include **Pine Flats**, **Kirkham**, **Givens** and **The Springs**.

## **Zoo Boise**

A must-visit attraction for animal lovers. Located along the **Boise River Greenbelt**, it's home to over 200 animals from around the world, including tigers, red pandas, meerkats, and native Idaho species. The zoo offers interactive exhibits, educational programs, and seasonal events, making it perfect for kids and adults alike.
